- WHEREAS:** Geology and the other earth sciences are fundamental to the safety, health and welfare of Oregonians and to the economy of Oregon; and
- WHEREAS:** The earth sciences are integral to locating, developing and conserving mineral, energy and water resources needed for Oregon's continuing prosperity; and
- WHEREAS:** The earth sciences provide the basis for preparing for and mitigating natural hazards such as earthquakes, floods, landslides, volcanic eruptions, coastal erosion and tsunamis experienced from time to time in Oregon; and
- WHEREAS:** The earth sciences are crucial to understanding environmental and ecological issues ranging from water and air quality to waste disposal and mined land regulation and reclamation; and
- WHEREAS:** Geological factors of resources, hazards and the environment are vital to land management and land use decisions made in Oregon; and
- WHEREAS:** The earth sciences contribute critical data to our understanding of, and respect for, Oregon's heritage and natural systems.

THEREFORE: I, Theodore R. Kulongoski, Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim **October 8-14, 2006** to be

EARTH SCIENCE WEEK

in Oregon and encourage all Oregonians to join in this observance.
